Principal's Word

Over the last week we have had a Book Fair in the school library, which was organised by Mrs Brett. It has been extremely successful with many parents and students coming in to purchase books. The success means we will be able to buy a number of new books for the library. Congratulations to Mrs Brett and thank you to the Safety Bay community.

School Council

The next School Council meeting will be on Tuesday 9th September at 3.30pm. At the previous meeting, held last term, a decision was made regarding school uniforms. Safety Bay, previous to 2014, had a policy that Year 6 and Year 7 students both wore navy shirts as their uniform, which is different to the rest of the school. The reasons provided to the council for the continuation of navy for both Years 5 and 6 were:

- Easier to make out the senior children on the oval when doing duty or searching for a student at break times.
- It provides the senior students an expectation of leadership.
- It gives parents two years of use with navy uniforms.
- There is an excess of navy stock that needed to be utilised.

A vote was undertaken and it was decided that both Year 5 and 6 students would wear navy uniforms and the remainder of the school would be dressed in royal blue.

Reading Eggs

As from Monday the school commenced the trial for Reading Eggs throughout the school. The trial will be for one month, with teachers then deciding if it is a viable program for Safety Bay Primary School. You will receive some information shortly about how you can include your child in the program from home. I know some parents already use the program at home with their children. If it is decided to implement the program a decision will be made as to how, as a school, we may fund it.

Student Centered Funding Model

On Wednesday (today), I am attending the Student Centred Funding Model training being provided to schools for implementation in 2015. Ms Casey and Mrs Tindale have already attended the training and we will now be able to plan for 2015. More information will be provided to the school community once it becomes available.

Due to a conflict of dates the NAIDOC Assembly scheduled for **Tuesday 19th August** has been changed to **Wednesday 10th September.**



BREAKFAST CLUB

Currently 20 - 30 students are enjoying toast, cereal, fruit, banana smoothies and Milo each Tuesday and Thursday morning at Breakfast Club in Challenger Block.

I would like to send a BIG thankyou to Gino at The Good Guys in Rockingham for donating four

toasters, two sandwich presses and two blenders toward our Breakfast Club. These have been of enormous benefit to running our Breakfast program.

Breakfast is one of the most important meals of the day, particularly for growing children.

Studies suggest that memory function of under-nourished children (eg. attention span, recall and concentration) is consistently benefited by the consumption of a healthy breakfast.

HANDWASHING

Hand washing is an important public health measure for reducing the impact of some communicable diseases such as influenza. Hand washing can also reduce the risk of exposure to common allergens such as peanuts for those in the school community who are anaphylactic.

Schools are expected to instruct students to wash their hands:

- immediately after visiting the toilet;
- before preparing food;
- before and after eating food;
- after being exposed to respiratory or other body fluids e.g. coughing or blowing their nose;
- after playing sport; and at any other time when hands are soiled.

Soap or another cleansing agent must be provided in all schools and students should be given developmentally appropriate instruction for effective hand washing. The Department of Health recommends the following steps:

Continued.....

- Wet hands, preferably with warm water.
- Apply hand washing agent e.g. soap, liquid soap.
- Lather the hands and fingers for at least 15 seconds.
- Rinse hands under running water.
- Where possible, taps in public toilets should be turned off using a paper towel to avoid possible re-contamination of hands.

Alternatively, hands can be cleaned using alcohol based products (gels, rinses, foams) containing an emollient that does not require the use of water.

Department of Health calls for chickenpox vaccinations. The Department of Health is reminding adults and children to get vaccinated for chickenpox. Chickenpox is a serious disease that can make children very sick and cause serious health complications in adults. WA has had 213 reported cases of chickenpox this year, and data from recent years shows the highest number of cases are reported in August.



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
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
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
